Katharine Smith *reflects on* Luke 3:1-6

he woodwork, walls and ceilings are being repainted. Threadbare carpets are being replaced; soft furnishings are being cleaned. Something exciting is happening. The news is in the air we breathe. He's coming, the king is coming at long last – quick, get ready, prepare for the promised day of the Lord, bringing freedom and peace.

And us? What about us? Are we clean and smart enough to meet the king? Certainly we'll wash and put on our best, maybe even new, clothes. But inside? We have to be clean inside as well? Suddenly we remember speaking unkindly about a colleague, being impatient with a friend, feeling jealous of someone's good fortune, hanging on to an old grudge. Suddenly we think of the words of the prophet Malachi: "who can endure the day of his coming?... he is like a refiner's fire... a refiner and purifier of silver". Suddenly we don't feel so excited after all. We are afraid of standing before the king "to whom all hearts are open, all desires known", as the Collect for Purity puts it. We become aware that we need God's refining fire and the deep waters of baptism. We know we need God's forgiveness and help to be ready to receive the Son, both in the Bethlehem stable, as we remember his birth, and at his coming again in clouds of glory.

Lord Jesus, as we prepare to celebrate your birth, help us also to prepare for your return. Give us a vision of your glory, shine your light in our darkness and bring joy and peace into our hearts and minds. Amen.

Yorkshire carols

Sheffield carols

Everybody knows carols like "Away in a Manger", but visit a pub in the north west of Sheffield before Christmas and you are likely to hear carols you've never heard before. From mid-November pubs are packed with locals singing



selections of carols distinct to each establishment. Some are so local they are named after particular Sheffield villages.

They have their roots in eighteenthcentury church music which was composed by local people and played on fiddles and wind instruments. In later years, after vernacular music fell out of favour with the church authorities, parish churches replaced this music with standardised hymns, robed choirs and organs. However, local musicians kept these carols alive, taking them around villages and into pubs, adding new festive tunes to their repertoire. While these carols have died out across most of England, in this tiny part of Yorkshire they are thriving.

Gospel Reading

Luke 3. 1-6

The Proclamation of John the Baptist

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah.

to guide our feet into the way of peace.'


