ast week we were out in the wilderness listening to John the Baptist calling people to repent and be baptised. We heard whim talking about the one who was to come after him, a powerful one, who would baptise with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Today John is yet unborn, held in his mother's womb – an unexpected but longed-for baby, to be born in fulfilment of God's promises. And the powerful one who is to come after John, Jesus, is also held in his mother's womb – an unexpected baby to be born because Mary said "yes" and accepted God's will for her. Even before their birth it seems John is aware of the presence of Jesus and lets his mother know that.

Both mothers-to-be are filled with joy and praise God for his great faithfulness and goodness to them and to their people. Mary sings of God's compassion and mercy and the justice he brings to all people.

We don't know if Elizabeth is still alive when her son meets his violent death. We do know that Mary's heart is pierced with bitter agony and grief when her son is nailed to the cross. And we can imagine that, when Jesus is raised from the dead, Mary again sings the songs of joy and praise that we hear today.
