
Our Covenant is to:

- commissioned, and receive their letter of commendation which is for 5 years.

- responding to God's call to minister to those in need.
- the listening ear of God
- able to work a flexible number of hours.

They:

- have specific gifts and interests they are encouraged to use.
- meet regularly for prayer, training and reflection.
- support one another with a "buddy system".
- aim to grow and develop their ministries in God's time and within His plan.
- seek to bring God's love to all people.
